**Sub : Changes in the curriculum of Computer Science and Informatics Practices  
and Introduction of Multimedia and Web Technology Code 067 as an  
Elective subject – Reg.**

Responding to the global changes in the field of Information technology, the CBSE has been periodically updating its curriculum in the subject of Computer Science (code no. 083) and Informatics Practices (code no. 065). The Board has presently decided to update its curriculum in the above subjects in senior school classes (XI & XII) from the ensuing academic year. Hence the new curriculum will be effective for class XI in the above subjects and the students appearing in March 2005 examinations will appear in the revised curriculum. The revised curriculum will be put up on our website shortly.

It has been further decided that in the subject of Informatics Practices, the allocation for weightage for theory and practical will be 70 and 30 as against the previous weightage of 60 and 40.


The Board will also be introducing the new subject of MULTIMEDIA AND WEB TECHNOLOGY Code 067 under the academic stream. The syllabus for the same is being put up on our website. The candidates are free to choose any or all the above subjects under the academic stream.

Schools intending to take this subject as an elective subject should apply on the prescribed form along with necessary fee. The application form for the additional subject can be downloaded from our website.

Schools offering this subject should have adequate infrastructure as prescribed for other subjects of Information technology and teachers with prescribed qualifications.

You are requested to kindly bring the above changes to the notice of all concerned in your school.
